PLAYER COMMITMENT

Practice & Game Player Commitment

- All training, practices and games are mandatory.
- Teams will normally train 2-3 times a week.
- If a player does not train, they will not play.
- There is NO GUARANTEED playing time in Classic Soccer.
- Playing time is based on attitude, commitment, ability, and merit
- Challenge Teams will be expected to play in 2-4 tournaments annually
- Classic Teams will be expected to play in 4-7 tournaments annually

Player Conduct Guidelines:

- Work hard at practice to improve soccer skills and understanding of the game
- Give coaches full attention. Specifically, stop talking when coaches are talking and do not distract others during practice
- Be respectful at all times to coaches, teammates, and administrators.
- Be willing to do whatever is asked of you in practice and games without Complaining!
- Commit to come each game on time, well rested, and with an attitude that “I will do whatever it takes to help my team win
- There will be a no tolerance policy with alcohol, drugs, and smoking.

The player conduct guidelines will be strictly enforced. If a player is struggling to follow-through on his/her commitment, the parents will be notified by the Head Coach on a first offense. If there is a second offense, the Director of Coaching will notify the parents . If a third offense occurs, the board will have the right to remove the player from the organization.

Parent Commitment

- Volunteer to help manage the team – uniforms, snacks, hotel, treasurer
- Ensure timely payment of fees and completion of all paper work
- Ensure players arrive at scheduled events on time
- Ensure players have proper equipment to play soccer
- Be on time in picking up players from all events
- Support the team and coach in their development
- Learn the game of Soccer
- Encourage/promote good sportsmanship and team work
- Communicate openly with coaching staff
- Refrain from shouting instructions to your child or yelling to the referees during games

Hopefully, these guidelines will assist you and everyone in our organization to create a productive and positive environment for our children to thrive in a competitive atmosphere that will help them grow as soccer players and individuals. We look forward to seeing you out on the field.
